He has been a long-time collaborator in the Radio Dubrovnik program, as a journalist and music editor. He has been a member of the Kaše a cappella group since its founding in 2007.

Since 2007, he has been the executive and later editor-in-chief of the student UNIDU radio at the University of Dubrovnik, and is one of its founders. Since the beginning of his studies, and later his employment at the University of Dubrovnik, he has been the head of the editorial staff of UNIDU Radio. He designed its program basis, with which he worked until 2010, when he received a concession for broadcasting in the narrower area of the city of Dubrovnik.
